- **2.B City Engineer: Written Report Specific Topics were discussed:**

- **2.C City Planner:** Specific Topics were discussed.
- **2.C1 Building Permit and Land Use Activity –** Clare reported no new permits or activity has taken place.

2.C2 Development/Improvement Agreement between R&B Development LLC, Dale Rainey and the City of Kootenai for development of Kootenai Commerce Center Phase 1 & 2 — Clare presented a development agreement summary and site plan documents for this project. She noted this is the first activity on this project in quite a while. The site plan showed 84 commercial units that include a small kitchen. Possible habitational usage of these units was discussed. Clare referred back to city code and read that only one habitational unit would be allowed. The development agreement summary indicates a dedication of a public easement trail connecting the south end of the property to the Pend d'Oreille Bay Trail. Councilman Schock questioned who would be responsible for the maintenance of that easement trail.

Councilman Sundquist moved to authorize the City Planner to submit the draft development agreement to the landowner to obtain clarifications regarding the land easement and maintenance and then submit to the City Attorney for review, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Councilman Schock, Roll call vote:
